Objectives of Webinar:

Initiatives taken by Government of India for Simplification of Passport services.

Description of Webinar:

The webinar was started by Mr. Arpit Patni by giving the introduction speech about CII and the webinar. He also introduced the speaker of the webinar, Ms Neetu M. Bhagotia, Regional Passport officer, Jaipur, Government of India. She is presently posted as Deputy Secretary (PP&R) Ministry of External Affairs. The main aim of the webinar was to know about different schemes associated with the digitalization of passport procedure and the growth in number of passport issuing to the citizens.

Ms Bhagotia focused on the Passport Seva Project, 2012. The main aim of this project is to extend Passport services to the citizens by expanding the network for Passport services and ensuring service delivery with greater security, reliability and defined service levels. This project simplified the passport services in India over the period of time. She said that India holds the 3rd

position in issuing passports preceded by China and America. She also linked the increase in passport issuing is directly related to the people going abroad. As more and more people are going abroad for their studies and jobs, the requirement of a passport increases at the same time. TATA consultancy services play a major role in the issue process of passports under the Passport Seva Project. Today there are around 555 passport offices in India.

MEA launched the M passport police App to improve the overall PVR processing cycling time. The app is available for download to the Police Station users who are already accessing the PSP Police (Web) Application for the purpose of Police Verification processing of the Passport Services applicants for recording the inputs of field verification processing done at the applicant's address.

She also introduced M passport seva app which provides facility to Register, Apply, Pay and Schedule appointment for Passport related services. If you have linked your documents with the digilocker, then the citizen need not to carry their documents to the passport office. It made it easy for the people to get their passports in less time. The users can track the status of their passport applications using file number and date of birth.

In the end a Q&A session was hosted by Mr. Abhinav Banthia. Mr. Arpit Patni ended this session by giving a thank you note to the speaker and the attendees and added that one day the passport services will be as quick as ordering food online.

Outcomes from webinar:


Students came to know about the various initiatives taken by the Ministry of External Affairs to ease out the process of passport issuing in the country and further digitalization in passport services.




INDUSTRIAL VIST

Dev Milk Foods Ltd

Objective: -To give practical exposure to students about functioning in an organization

About Dev Milk Foods Pvt. Ltd. (DMF)

Established in 2004, Dev Milk Foods Pvt. Ltd. (DMF) is milk & dairy products company with its headquarters at Jaipur (Rajasthan) in North India. Since 2004, DMF has been involved in multiple projects covering manufacturing, marketing & transportation of milk & dairy products. DMF was instrumental in establishing one of the first private dairies in Rajasthan for packaged milk and quickly progressed to become the largest private dairy & one of the most reputable dairies of Rajasthan. DMF has established a state-of-the-art ice cream & bakery factory in one of the premium industrial areas of Jaipur, Mahindra World City. This is DMF's most ambitious & prestigious project undertaken so far. The factory is one of the best ice cream & bakery factories in Northern India.

Summary of visit:

An Industrial Visit was organized by the management department of IIS (Deemed to be University) at Frubon's Ice – Cream and dairy factory which is a project of Dev Milk Food (DMF). Since its inception DMF has successfully diversified its operations and pioneered its horizon by launching Frubon. Moreover the students were thoroughly explained the process of Ice- Cream making by showing the installed machinery and equipment .Be it the central lab , cold storage , or the store houses, students were made well acquainted with each step gradually right from the collection of raw milk from chilling centers to the dispatching, the process had been kept transparent . Frubon's manufacturing unit is spread over 60,000 sq. ft. with 170+ variants in Ice- Cream & Dairy time. They aim to achieve the most innovative & admired food company of the world which seemed possible when we analyzed their work pattern.

LEARNING OUTCOME

There are plenty number of learnings we acquired by the visit such as the significance of the departmentalization. Since every procedure in the factory was organize, secondly the

manufacturing strategies followed by hygiene maintenance we were arranged by them. How even the most diminutive step was being taken care of following the FSSAI guidelines, taking precautionary measures are an integral part of food based manufacturing factory. This visit offered a great source to gain practical knowledge. When the steps are observed and learned as to how theoretical concepts from books are put to into action, it counts in a great learning exposure. After the factory tour all our doubts were answered which therefore helped us identify our prospective areas of work in the overall organizational function .This visit was hence a major count in adding our practical learning.
